- Collecting and reporting essential demographic characteristics of the respondents, such as average age, gender distribution, and socioeconomic status;
- Providing more information about the questionnaire development process, including the specific items used. This would
 ensure that the questionnaire is valid and reliable; and
- Providing more details about the coding mechanism for the interviews and whether triangulation was used.
