Dear Authors,

Congratulations on your work. I enjoyed reading it. I have some suggestions to improve your research. Here they are:

- 1. First, Zambia can be added as a keyword.
- 2. Second, it is good to read about the regions' status. However, it would be more beneficial to shorten the introduction section to ensure readability.
- 3. Pay attention to the ordering of in-text citations. For example, on page 2 (Falloon, 2020; Bejaković & Mrnjavac, 2020; van Laar et al., 2020; Tohara & Al, 2021).
- 4. It may be more useful to provide the "1.1. Objectives of the Study" section before the methodology. Additionally, in this section, it would be helpful to emphasize Zambia and mention that a comparison with other regions will be made.
- 5. Correcting some spelling mistakes will make the work more professional. For example, on page 5, "continent. (Kolog et al., 2022)".
- 6. The number of teachers could be given in section 3.2.
- 7. Were 10 or 20 schools used in the study? The abstract mentions 20, but the methods section mentions 10. It should be clarified.
- 8. Instead of repeating the information from the table in the text, it would be more beneficial to provide only a portion of this information and include brief interpretations based on the data. In addition, for questions that contain a small amount of information, only providing the text instead of both the table and the text can improve readability.
- 9. Including recent studies from 2023 can strengthen the research.
